BWS Language Evening Classes – Course Description



Advanced French



So that speaking French becomes second nature

Required starting level

Approximately A-level.

This friendly group has been meeting for several years and welcomes new members proficient in spoken French. The course content varies with the students' needs and personal interests as well as events and topical issues that are being debated or discussed in the press and news. It is an opportunity to extend the range of your vocabulary and colloquial expressions whilst exploring French culture (cinema, literature), its customs and people.

Aims

With a teacher who is a native speaker, the aim is to give students an opportunity to discuss topical matters and to further their progress by encountering diverse fields of vocabulary. The focus remains strongly on listening, speaking and pronunciation practice.

The course runs for a school year with classes taking place over three terms. On completion of the course, you will be able to express your own ideas and views clearly, using the appropriate structures and tenses.

Working methods/types of activities

Video and audio material, songs as well as short stories may be used as a base to explore and discuss French people's lives, habits and values. Keeping abreast of the news through press articles and online newspapers helps us explore various new lexical fields and particularly fresh, trendy and topical vocabulary. Some material is used as a base to revise grammar.

- Conversation is an essential part of the course.
- Most weeks, notes or newspaper articles are given out.
- Students may wish to give short presentations regarding topics of interest dear or important to them to the rest of the group.
- Exploration of grammar, idiomatic structures, styles and alternative turns of phrases.

There are no books to purchase for this course.

Homework

Ideally, students should spend a couple of hours a week going over the notes and preparing for the next class. Students are advised to listen to the radio and go on the internet to keep up with current affairs. They are also encouraged to make presentations on subjects that interest them as a base for a conversation or debate.
