Four years ago when girls first joined the school we had seven girls players, Covid hit and sport was all but cancelled, the next year we had ten and made our Rosslyn Park debut.




## A Note From Mr Hole

I sit here wondering where to start and endless words keep coming into my head: loyalty, trust, respect, togetherness, fun, hard-working, complicated, frustrating, understanding and many more, but the netball at Bishop's has come a long way since we began four years ago. We started with a handful of girls coming into the school at difficult times (Covid). They were new, walking into the cauldron of Bishop's, 1000 boys to 40 girls, only 15 of whom were up for the challenge of playing competition netball. These were girls from many different schools, who faced a number of challenges including being the first cohort, learning a different style of play and creating a unique ethos that would grow and develop.

Since then, Bishop's netball has certainly grown. From one or two fixtures, we are now playing a full fixture list, taking on the likes of Team Bath Salisbury ADC, Marlborough and Dauntsey's. The 2023 squad currently commit to four training sessions per week and through this, have developed a style of play which is exciting, fast and a touch different.

Since I first started playing rugby 5 years ago, I have experienced how quickly women's sport is growing. I have played rugby for Dorset and Wilts, in the Bristol Bears Academy, for Bath 7s and in the UR7s National Academy.

Throughout this time the presence of women's sport, specifically rugby, is continually increasing on an international scale. This is now being reflected within BWS, who are now taking their first girls sports team international. I remember being sat in the Aerobics Studio 3 years ago, there were 7 of us interested in playing rugby, just enough for one 7s squad with no subs. If you had told us that just 3 years later there was an inaugural girls sports tour with over 30 girls attending we would never of believed you.

Yet I can't say I'm surprised, it is clear that Bishop's is a community that will encourage female athletes to grow and reach their highest potential. Last year there were just 20 of us and I had the privilege of captaining the girls rugby team. We had a successful year winning West of England and becoming quarter finalists at Rosslyn Park. In just a short time BWS sport has achieved so much and I'm excited to continue to watch it grow.

The girls have shown commitment, passion and enjoyment, willingly dedicating numerous hours throughout the week to allow them to compete at such a high standard. I have loved every opportunity that rugby at BWS has given me and now on my gap year, while working as a Sports Assistant, I get to give back to the coaches and the sport that developed me so much not only as a player but as a person. This tour is the first of many and I am certain it will create friendship and memories to last a lifetime.
