

WELCOME

The quotation on the front of our order of service comes from a famous local poet and priest. George Herbert (1593-1633) lived on the outskirts of Salisbury and was Vicar of the Churches of Fugglestone with Bemerton. His poetry leapfrogs the ages with surprising ease and I have often turned to this quotation about oak trees and roots this year. Bishop's has not had the year we had expected, yet as we come once more to Founder's Day, our school has deep roots from which to draw strength and confidence as we enter a new stage of our life together.

"Roots" forms our theme this morning. We will start with a lone voice speaking John Wordsworth's own words from beside his monument in the Trinity Chapel. Our founder loved our school. A friend of his commented "it was the first place he went on arriving at home, and he thought all his visitors would like to see it too". You can hear his pride in these words. Look carefully and you will be able to glimpse the Cross and candles of the procession beside his monument through the iron tracery behind the High Altar.

We will move to give thanks for Old Wordsworthians who have died during the year. We have common roots with them and each matters to us. We have revived words from the 1950 Bishop Wordsworth's School Chapel prayer book to commission our new prefects for whom today marks the start of their tenure, getting in touch, once again, with our roots.

We are delighted to have Revd Ross Meikle, Missioner for young people at the Cathedral as our preacher this morning. Since arriving in Salisbury a year ago, Ross has quickly become a friend to Bishop's, leading Eucharists in the school Chapel, assemblies in the Sport's Hall and helping at our whole school Eucharist a few weeks back. He is a writer and story-teller; his background before Ordination was in theatre and he memorably points out in a blog that his surname rhymes with treacle! We are delighted to have him, Canon Edward Probert, our Governor and very long term friend, and Katie Fitzsimmons, Diocesan Director of Education with us today as we end a term and look forward towards a new chapter for our school.

The congregation remains seated as a procession moves to Bishop John Wordsworth's memorial in the Trinity Chapel. His words are spoken by Jonathan Ivess-Mash, Year 13 Historian.
