





# 4. Adaptive Teaching Strategies

- High-Ability: Leading roles, directing, practitioner research, critical evaluation.
- Struggling Learners: Scaffolded written work, role cards, structured improvisation.
- Engagement Focus: Active physical starters, competition-based rehearsal games, and creative design tasks.
- SEND / SEMH: Clear visual prompts, predictable routines, non-verbal participation.

## 5. Cross-Curricular Links

- English: Shakespeare, Animal Farm, narrative structure.
- Art/DT: Mask-making and set design sketches.
- History: Ancient Greece, Renaissance Italy, WWII (Brecht).

## 6. GCSE Prep Roadmap

- Year 7: Introduction to text analysis and non-verbal performance.
- Year 8: Broaden performance vocabulary with physical theatre and Kabuki/Noh.
- Year 9: Practitioner study (Brecht), devising, analytical writing.

By the end of KS3, students will have explored three Shakespeare plays, four global theatre traditions, and devised theatre, providing a robust foundation for GCSE Drama.
