

Your best way of showing off your ability is by displaying a range of tenses.

Use as many tenses as you can

Talk about other people, not just yourself

This can include their opinion- it shows that you can conjugate verbs successfully.

Do some research and collect idioms that you can remember and use in a variety of contexts.

Include idiomatic language

Accuracy is at the heart of great writing

Use a variety of connectives

Avoiding repetition is important, as is extending your sentences whenever possible.

Consider how you introduce a change of tense. You should avoid starting every sentence with a verb.

Vary your sentence starters

Express and justify your opinions

Consider different ways of expressing your opinion. You should always try to avoid repeating yourself.

Always remember to leave time to check your work for accuracy, and look back at previous written work for targets that your teacher has set you.
